

About This Book...

This book is an account of Harald and Thorbjor Haraldson and their family of 8 children, chronicling their early lives in Norway. It then outlines the family and succeeding generations after emigration to America.

The loose format of this book is deliberate. It is made so that anyone having a copy can insert material of his own anywhere throughout its pages, thus forming a more complete work tailor-made to his needs.

The Beck supplement, for instance appearing at the back of this book, is only the first of such supplements delineating the families of generation III. Another supplement - that of Thor's family, now is in the printing stage. Other family descendents may wish to add their own supplements.




THE HARALDSONS IN AMERICA

The Early Years

Little is known about the lives of Harald Haraldson and his wife, Thorbjor (sometimes spelled Torborg, Torbjorg, or Torbjor) Siggurdsdatter. They were born in Hjartdal (pronounced Yartdahl), Telemark Province, Norway. Thorbjor's father was Sigurd Thorson; mother, Martha Hermandsdatter. Harald spent some of his young manhood as an apprentice - sailor on the sea. From their eight children's baptismal and confirmation records*, it is known that they lived on several farms, all in this area, each having a name. The name of the farm was often added to the surname. Anne, (pronounced Ah-neh'), the first child, and probably Thor and Olle were born at Kasestuel under Hotvedt. (Sometimes spelled Haatvedt). Kasestuel is a cottars allotment. Later the family lived at Guttenhuus, Skolehuise and Praestegaarden. The three younger children were born on the farm Hvaale, Hvaalsbak.

The education of the children was accomplished through the church. Confirmation study was included as well as reading and writing. Arithmetic was considered unimportant for the girls so only the boys had this subject in school. Nevertheless, in this family, the girls were taught some arithmetic at home. At times, there were as many as 100 students in their school. They attended school primarily in the winter for as soon as they were physically able, they assisted with the farm work. After they immigrated to the U.S., only the youngest, Ingeri (Ida) received some formal education. Thor taught himself to read the Icelandic language because he loved to read the old sagas dealing with legends or historical exploits.

The older children early learned to help with the farm work. Summers were often lonely. Then, they left their family, moving to the "seter", the mountain meadows while making cheese and herding the grazing goats and a few cows. Several neighbors cooperated in using the same seter. (In some areas of Norway, this summer pasture area was called a stol). The building the children slept in was a primitive summer cottage called a "sel." Hay was cut on the small patches of farm land and stored on the farm for winter use. Also small grain and potatoes were grown amongst the numerous rocks. According to the Hjartdal census of 1865, the family, then living on the Hvaale farm possessed two "big animals," four sheep, four goats, and growing barley, oats and potatoes. At that time, this was considered a prosperous household.

With the help of his uncle, Thor Sigurdson in America, Thor left Norway four years earlier than his family, coming to Davis, Illinois in the spring of 1871. He was then 17 years old and could speak no English. After working on farms for four years he had saved sufficient money to repay his passage and help the rest of his family come to the U.S. Meantime, the other older children were also earning money. Ragnild, who was then only 15, had saved \$40 for her passage.

On April 30, 1875, Harald, Thorbjor and the other seven children left from the port of Christiania*, sailing on the ship "Hero" with destination: Beloit, Wisconsin. Enroute, the ship docked in Liverpool where they stayed one week. Later, the children reminisced about the fun they had playong ont he docks and the kindness shown by the sailors in the area. There they tasted their first tomatoes and oranges. Ragnild bit into a tomato thinking it would taste like an apple, but it "tasted awful." Descendants also recall hearing tales of Harald's great generosity. Food on the ship was limited. There were times when Thorbjor was worried that their children would be denied necessities because her husband was so willing and ready to share food and possessions.

The steamship took them to Quebec and down the St. Laurence River, where they took an emigrant train to Chicago and Davis, Ill. Passenger seating was on long benches along the wall of the box car. Often these same cars were used for transporting cattle. When they finally arrived in Davis, Ill., across the state border from Beloit, Wis. father Harald had spent almost all of his money. A lady in Davis fed the children bread and milk which "tasted so good" since they had been without fresh food during the trip.

As with many of these sturdy pioneers, their dauntless spirit and good humor sustained them through these difficult times. They were fun-loving, enjoyed a joke and loved to dance. Harold II was especially good with the "hollingkast." This was a solo

dance whereby, with kicking, a young man tried to remove a hat on top of a pole held by a second man. Descendants recall hearing that "Harold II could kick almost as high as the ceiling."

After about three years' residence in Illinois, the family moved to Buena Vista County, Iowa.

Thor Sigurdson, a brother of Thorbjor Siggurdsdatter, had come to the U.S. in 1861 and lived in Illinois and Wisconsin until 1877 when he purchased land in Sections 28 and 21, Barnes Township of Buena Vista County. From court records, it is known that Thor Haraldson purchased 40 of these acres from Thor Sigurdson in July, 1877 for \$300.

Harald's first land purchase was in March 1886 when he purchased 40 acres for \$220 from the lowa Falls and Sioux City R.R. Co. This was located in Section 21 of Barnes Township, SW¼ of SW¼.

The following year in April 1887, Harald purchased 80 acres from Thor Sigurdson, E½ of SE¼ in Section 21 for \$176. A year later, in December 1888, Harald purchased 40 acres from his son, Thor, who was then married and living in Illinois. This parcel, NW¼ of NW¼ of Section 28 was the same 40 acres that son Thor had earlier purchased from his uncle. Harald paid \$300, or \$7.50 an acre. Thus he owned a total of 160 acres. Section 21 is across the road from Section 28 and is located three and a-half miles southeast of Linn Grove, Iowa.

At first Harald and family lived in a log house. Later a frame house was built for them by Hans Beck for about \$200. The house was located on the northwest corner of the land in Section 28, adjoining the Sigurdson farm.

It was at this time that Hans Beck became acquainted with the Haraldson's daughter, Anne, whom he later married. Axel Engebretsen rented land from and lived with Thor Sigurdson, and through this connection, he met Thebe (Thorbjorg) Haraldson, whom he later married.

The Haraldson sons worked on farms and helped build the railroad in the area. Sons Harold II, Sam (Soren) and Ole eventually owned farms near Rembrandt in Buena Vista County. Driving past these farms, one is still impressed with the prevalence of evergreen trees, a poignant reminder of the land from which these pioneers had come. Ole, who came to own a half-section, bordered his land on three sides with evergreen trees.

Thor Haraldson purchased a farm in Stephenson County near Davis, Illinois in 1902. He had been employed as a farm laborer for Hellick Knudson, later marrying his daughter, Alice Knudson. With his brother-in-law, Halvor Loe (Ragnild's husband), he purchased a ½ section of land nine miles southwest of Hanley, Saskatchewan, Canada in 1906, but later sold his interest. Halor Loe bought the south ½ section 4.

Harald and Thorbjor's family worshiped God in the Little Sioux Valley Lutheran Church built in 1887 in the southwest corner of Section 27 of Barnes Township. Hans Beck also helped build this church. Thor Sigurdson was one of the signers of the Articles of Incorporation. The Haraldson daughters, Ingeri (Ida) and Thorbjorg (Thebe) were confirmed in this church in 1882 and 1886 respectively.

After Harald's wife died, he was cared for by daughter Thebe who lived with him until her marriage in 1901. Harald then lived with his daughter, Ragnild (Nellie) Loe in Linn Grove until his death in 1902. Harald and Thorbjor were buried in the Little Sioux Valley Cemetery which was adjacent to the church. There was no will. Ragnild's husband was appointed administrator of the estate. The farmland was soon sold with the subsequent warranty deeds drawn up by H.E. Loe, attorney in fact.

In February, 1902, 40 acres were sold to Thor Sigurdson for \$7.50 an acre. In April of the same year, the heirs sold another 40 acres to N.P. Nelson for \$45 an acre. Then the following year in March 1903, the remaining 80 acres were sold to Oluf Sewalson for \$65 an acre. Oluf was married to Ingri Sigurdson, the daughter of Thor Sigurdson, and a niece of Thorbjor Haraldson. The Sewalsons lived in the house for several years. Then the house was sold and moved to Rembrandt where it still stands in the northwest part of town. It has since been remodeled and a room has been add-

ed to the original structure. Oswald Sewalson, Oluf's son, now owns the farm and it was declared a "Century Farm" in 1977.

When Ragnild Haraldsd. was born, Harald Haraldsen was farmer at Praestegaarden, probably a tennant. Then he moved to Hvaale, Hvaalsbak."





Mrs. Anna Beck Dies Suddenly

Well Known Resident of Clay County Succumbs to Apoplexy Sunday

Mrs. Anna Beck, a resident of Clay County for 46 years, passed away at her home, 453 East Third street, Spencer, Sunday morning as the result of an attack of apoplexy following a heart attack suffered the previous day. Mrs. Beck was among the well known and well liked residents of Spencer and was well known in all parts of the county. She was the mother of Robt. H. Beck of Meadow township, president of the Clay County Farm Bureau.

As was her usual custom, Mrs. Beck spent Saturday afternoon down town shopping and greeting old friends. While enroute home, she suffered a heart attack in front of the Dr. H.O. Green offices on East Fourth street but, after receiving physician's care, was able to be taken home. Apparently she rested easily during the night and about 6:30 o'clock Sunday morning her daughter, Mrs. H.W. Christensen, asked her how she felt. She replied that she was feeling better and returned to her sleep. Mrs. Christensen went into the bedroom again shortly before eight o'clock and then discovered that her mother was dead. She has suffered a paralytic stroke in her sleep but there was a smile on her face, thus giving no indication of pain.

Funeral to Be Friday

Funeral services will be held Friday afternoon from the home on East Third street at 1:30 o'clock and at the Danish Lutheran church, East Fifth street, at 2:00 o'clock. Rev. K. Nyegaard, pastor of the Bethany Danish Lutheran church of Spencer, will officiate. Burial will be made in Meadow cemetery northeast of Spencer.

Anna Haroldson was born July 16, 1851, near Kongsberg, Norway, where she lived until in May, 1875, when she came to America where she joined a brother in Davis, Illinois. She lived at Davis and at Beloit, Wisconsin, until in 1878; when she came to Storm Lake. She remained in Storm Lake until in 1879 when she came to Clay county and was employed by Joe Evans, whó was owner of a stage line to and from Spencer at that time. C.M. Pinneo, then a youth, was one of the stage drivers. She was employed at Storm Lake in the homes of Judge Thomas, James Toy and Guy Mack

Her marriage to H.R. Beck was solemnized February 28, 1882, at Storm Lake and following their marriage they removed to a farm in Meadow township settling on a farm five miles northwest of Spencer, where they lived for six years. Later they moved to a farm next to the one which they had occupied. Here they farmed until Mr. Beck's death on April 24, 1908. After Mr. Beck's death, Mrs. Beck continued on the farm until in September, 1918, when she moved to Spencer where she had since resided at 453 East Third street.

Those Who Survive Her

Mr. and Mrs. Beck became of the parents of five children, all of whom survive. They are: Mrs. H.W. Christensen of Peterson, R.H. Beck of Spencer, Mrs. P.L. Hjelm of Wendling Oregon, G.E. Beck of Hinsdale, Illinois, and Mrs. Alfred Underwood of Peterson. All of the children will be present for the services Friday. G.E. Beck arrived Monday morning from Hinsdale and Mrs. Hjelm is expected to arrive from Oregon this Thursday afternoon from Sheldon. The other children reside in and near Spencer.

Three brothers and three sisters also survive, Thor Haroldson of Davis, Illinois, Harold and Sam Haroldson of Rembrandt, Iowa, Mrs. H.E. Loe of Madison, Minnesota, Mrs. Axel Engebretson of Linn Grove, and Miss Ida Haroldson of Spencer. The oldest brother preceded the remainder of the family to America and the only time that the whole family were united was at the time of their arrival at his home from Norway. Another brother Ole, a former resident of Meadow township, died at Rembrandt in May, 1926.

Mrs. Beck was a member of St. Paul's Danish Lutheran church of Meadow township and later of the Bethany Lutheran of Spencer.

The Typical Record of the Passing of an Iowa Home Maker

Dante M. Pierce, writing editorially in the lowa Homestead last week, pays a very spendid tribute to the late Mrs. Anna Beck, who passed away in this city on February 5 following a stroke of apoplexy. Although no names are mentioned any one familiar with the circumstances knows that Mrs. Beck is the "lowa Home Maker" referred to. The paper from which the facts are gleaned is The NewsHerald. Mr. Pierce says:

A few days ago I picked up a copy of a well known lowa weekly newspaper, and was attracted by the picture of a motherly looking woman, who, it appeared, had quietly passed at the close of a well spent life. The obituary notice recounted her useful career, and expressed the sorrow of the community at her death.

The name of this woman is not of importance in connection with the comments which I am making upon her life. The notice was a typical one, however, and of a character which is seen only too frequently in the newspapers. It recorded merely the passing of one of many thousands of Iowa pioneer men and women, who, from humble beginnings, have done so much to make the state what it is.

It reviewed the fact that this woman was born in Norway in 1851, came to America in 1875, and settled in Iowa in 1879. It casually referred to the fact that she had been employed as a maid in the homes of three well-to-do citizens of the county seat. She then married a young farmer, removing with her husband to a farm, where they began life in 1882. They lived on this farm for six years, and moved to another one where they farmed until her husband's death in 1908. After his death this woman operated the farm for another 10 years, then removing to town, where she died.

It was the simple story of a life, but in this story is to be found all of the romance and energy of America. Five children, scattered from Illinois to Oregon, survive. One of them is an Iowa county Farm Bureau president. The others are respected and useful citizens of their communities. This death no doubt received little public attention outside of the small community in which she lived, and probably not so much even there. Yet the brief story of a useful life which I have repeated above has a very keen appeal to me. It is of lives like this that Iowa and the west have been built. The peasant girl, making her way as best she could in a strange land, perhaps ridiculed for her dialect and her strange ways, becoming the home maker and the family founder, and leaving behind her a fine family of sons and daughters who will never forget her influence.

This life was one well worth living and worthy of far more praise in its accomplishments than those of many of greater note.

FUNERAL SERVICES HELD SUNDAY FOR MRS. CHRISTENSON

Mrs. Hans W. Christenson of Royal, 48, highly respected and well known through Clay County, passed away Thursday morning, April 28, 1932, at eight o'clock at the St. Joseph's hospital in Sioux City where she had been a patient since the fourteenth of April. Mrs. Christenson received treatment at the hospital for several days and on April 18 underwent an operation. She recovered satisfactorily until complications suddenly developed which resulted in death.

Funeral services were conducted Sunday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at the home and at two o'clock at the Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Royal with the Rev. A.P. Anderson in charge. The attendance of more than seven hundred relatives and friends evinced the high esteem of the deceased.

Mrs. George Sherman of Sioux Rapids sang "One Sweetly Solemn Thought" and Theodore Nelson sang "Sometime We'll Understand."

Rev. Andersen spoke very impressively, choosing his text from I Samuel 20:18 "Then Jonathan said to David, Tomorrow is the new moon; and thou shalt be missed, because thy place will be empty." The choir sang "Abide With Me". Interment was made in the Willow Creek Cemetery.

Thora Christene Beck was born December 13, 1883, at Spencer, Iowa. She was the daughter of Hans and Anna Haraldson Beck and was the oldest of five children. Her childhood was spent at the family home north of Spencer and her early education was obtained in the rural schools. Later she attended high school at Spencer and was a student of State Teachers' college at Cedar Falls.

For several years she taught in various localities of Clay County, being at one time instructor in the Royal School. Later she was instructor and student of the Lutheran church college at Elk Horn, Iowa.

On September 12, 1907, she was united in marriage to Hans W. Christenson and they established their home four miles south of Royal where they have resided for over twenty-four years.

Five children were born to them, a son, Herbert Paul, dying in infancy. They have two sons and two daughters, Raymond, Curtis, Amy and Corinne.

She was a devoted wife and mother, an untiring and faithful worker in her church and community. In early girlhood she was confirmed and ever remained a faithful member of the Lutheran Church. For many years she taught a class in the Bethlehem Lutheran Sunday School at Royal and was in charge of the Young Men's Bible class at the time of her death.

She was instrumental in the organization of the Bethlehem Sewing Circle and was its secretary and treasurer for ten years, later serving as editor of a cook book which was published by this society.

For fifteen years she assisted her husband in serving as secretary of the Clay township school board and for several years acted as secretary of the Willow Creek cemetery association. She was an active worker for the Farm Bureau and had served as chairman of the Women's work in Clay township.

Beside her husband and children she is survived by two sisters and two brothers. They are Mrs. Peter Hjelm and Mrs. Alfred Underwood of Peterson, Robert H. Beck of Spencer and George E. Beck of Illinois.

The groom is a son of Mr. and Mrs. L.T. Hjelm of the hustling young farmers of the neighborhood. Pete, as he is known to all of us, is to be congratulated on his selection of a helpmate. They will reside on the home place as soon as L.T. moves to Peterson, which will be some time the first of next month.

BECK -- PRESTON

On Tuesday evening at eight o'clock, September 17th, 1918, occurred the marriage of Miss Lorene Marguerite Preston, daughter of Mrs. Lou J. Preston, of thirty-second and John Lynde Road, Des Moines, Iowa to George Edward Beck of Spencer, Iowa. The service was read at the home of the bride by Dr. Orange Howard Cessna, chaplain of the Iowa State College at Ames, in the presence of immediate relatives.

The bride has made Des Moines her home for a number of years and is a graduate of North Des Moines High School and of the Home Economics course in Iowa State College at Ames, where she was very prominent in college activities. For the past year she has taught in the high school at Conrad, Iowa.

The groom is the son of Mrs. Anna Beck and has grown to manhood at his home northeast of Spencer. He graduated from Spencer High School and from the engineering course at the lowa State College where he met his bride.

Mr. and Mrs. Beck will make their home on a farm four and one-half miles northeast of Spencer.

MR. AND MRS. GEO. BECK DIE IN CRASH SON IS CRITICAL Daughter Is Also Hurt in Rt. 64 Accident BULLETIN

While the condition of Roland Beck remains critical, physicians said today that Bonnie Beck will recover. Only Bonnie has been told of the death of her parents. Two of the three attending physicians believe Roland will recover, the other is not optimistic. Roland is conscious only at intervals. His condition has not allowed X-rays and it is impossible to feed him anything but glucose. Both are suffering greatly from shock.

Heart-breaking tragedy marked the Christmas holidays for this city when an automobile-train accident took the lives of two beloved citizens, Mr. and Mrs. George E. Beck, and left their two children, Roland, 19 and Bonnie, 15 critically injured.

Mr. and Mrs. Beck are dead and their two children are in the Glidden Memorial hospital at DeKalb as a result of an accident Tuesday night in which Mr. Beck's machine crashed into a moving Milwaukee road freight train three miles west of Sycamore near the intersection of Route 64 and the Anne Glidden blacktop road. Mr. Beck was traveling east on Route 64, returning home after spending the Christmas holidays with relatives and friends at Spencer and Mason City, Ia.

Auto is Demolished

The Beck machine plowed into the 16th car ahead of the caboose of the 44 car train. The car was demolished, and the occupants pinned in the wreckage. The freight car was badly damaged and was unhooked before the train could be moved. The damaged freight car remained on the tracks, however, as did the other cars in the train.

The wrecked freight car blocked the crossing of Route 64 resulting in a traffic jam and making it necessary to take the injured persons to DeKalb instead of to this city, which would have been much nearer.

Mr. Beck was killed instantly. The mother died at 11 o'clock the next morning at St. Mary's hospital in DeKalb. The children remain at the Gliden hospital.

Son's Condition Critical

The death of Mrs. Beck came as a result of numerous broken bones, a severe scalp wound, internal injuries and shock. Roland, the son, remains in a critical condition, suffering from shock, one broken arm, fractures of both legs, a pelvic fracture and shoulder injury. Physicians believe Bonnie Beck will recover although she is suffering from three ribs torn from her spine, back injuries and numerous lacerations. She also is suffering greatly from shock which caused her body generally to weaken. She needs all her strength to recover.

The train which the Beck machine struck was on the seldom used railroad tracks of the outer belt line of the Chicago, Milwaukee and Gary railroad, its principal customer being the Wurlitzer plant at DeKalb.

Lived on High Street

The Beck home is at 213 East High street. Roland Beck is a sophomore at Northern Illinois State Teachers college at DeKalb and has been an usher at the Fargo theatre here. Bonnie is a popular sophomore at Sycamore High school.

Both College Graduates

Lorene Preston, the daughter of Herbert and Luana Jackson Preston was born in Des Mones, Ia. on December 30, 1894. She received her eduation in that city and graduated from the Des Moines High school. She later graduated from Iowa State College at Ames, Ia.

On September 18, 1918 she was united in marriage to George Eduard Beck and for several years they resided in Des Moines, later moving to Illinois.

George Eduard Beck, the son of Hans and Anna Haraldson Beck was born near Spencer, la. on December 27, 1889. He attended rural schools in that vicinity and later graduated from the Spencer high school. He also graduated from Iowa State College

Moved to Sycamore in 1930


Mr. and Mrs. Beck and their three children moved to Sycamore in 1930, where he has since been employed as draftsman for the Anaconda Wire & Cable Company. He was formerly with the Western Electric Company in Aurora, Elmhurst and other towns near Chicago. Since their arrival here they have taken a prominent part in civic and church affairs, Mrs. Beck has been treasurer of the Methodist Women's Union Missionary Society and Mr. Beck is treasurer of the church. He has also been a member of the Board of Trustees and taught the Intermediate boys of the Methodist Sunday school.

They are survived by their son, Roland, aged 19, and daughter, Bonnie, aged 15, and Mrs. Beck is also survived by her mother, Mrs. Herbert Preston of Mason City, la. a sister, Mrs. Robert Schiefeldbein of Dexter, Minn. and two brothers, Foster Preston and Perry Preston, both of Mason City.

Double Funeral Saturday

Besides his children, Mr. Beck is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Alfred Underwood of Royal, Ia. and Mrs. P.L. Hjelm of Eugene, Ore., and a brother, Robert Beck of Spencer, Ia. An older sister, Mrs. Hans Christiansen of Spencer, has preceeded him in death. The Beck's youngest daughter, Rosemary, passed away at the age of 10 years on January 11 of this year.

Double funeral services will be accorded Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Methodist church with the Rev. C.H. Draper officiating. Burial will be in Elmwood Cemetery.

Born in Hjartdal Telemark, Norway, December 30, 1853, on farm Haatvedt. Baptized on January 22, 1854 Confirmed October 18, 1868 Vaccinated 1854

He was the oldest of four sons having one sister, Anne, older and three sisters younger. His schooling consisted of winter confirmation study, learning to read and write. Summers were lonely times herding goats and a few cows and helping to make cheese high in the mountains. Hay was cut on the small patches of ground and stored on the farm for winter use. Also small grains and potatoes were grown amongst the numerous rocks. According to the Hjartdal census for 1865 the family was living on the Hvaale farm possessing two "big animals," four sheep, four goats and growing barley, oats and potatoes. This was considered at that time quite prosperous.

With the help of his Uncle, Thor Sigurdson, in America, he came to Davis, Illinois the spring of 1871. He was then seventeen years old and could speak no English. After working on the farms for four years he had saved enough to pay back for his passage and help the rest of his family to come to Davis, Illinois in 1875 where they lived until they moved to Buena Vista County, Iowa in 1879.



Thor and Alice [Knudson] Haraldson on their wedding day, November 6, 1882.







CARL ABNER HARALDSON

Carl Abner Haraldson was born near Davis February 10, 1893 and died at the home of his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Thor Haraldson on Thursday, May 21, 1914, age 21 years, 3 months and 11 days. He was confirmed December 13, 1908 in the Rock Run Lutheran Church by Rev. W. A. Johnson. He graduated from the Davis High School on June 9th, 1911 with high honors. He was of a very industrious disposition and desired to learn more and better to fit himself for the future, so decided to take a college course. He entered Luther College at Decorah, Iowa on January 9th, 1912. He had completed his second year course and returned home for his summer vacation April 23rd. He was taken sick May 5th and operated on for appendicitis on May 12th. The appendix had broken before the operation and left him in a very serious condition. He lingered between life and death until May 21st, when be breathed his last. All that medical science could do for him was done, but it was of no avail, as his time had come.

He was a Christian young man and was an honorary member of the Davis W.C.T.U. and was held in high esteem by all who knew him. From early childhood, he displayed a studious disposition and an eagerness for knowledge.

Beside his parents, he is survived by 5 brothers, Harald and Martin of Davis, John, who is attending the college at Decorag, Iowa, and Osmund and Elmer of Hanley, Sask., Canada and three sisters Mrs. Thora Fisher of Pearl City and Misses Mabel and Alice at home. The funeral was held Monday afternoon, May 25th at the Norwegian Lutheran Church. Rev. W.A. Johnson, of Capron, officiating. The attendance was large and the floral offering very beautiful. Thor Haraldson was born in Hjraldal, Telemark, Norway December 30, 1853. In 1870, he was married to Alice Lavena Knudson. The children will make their home here. K.O. Knudson and Miss Anna Knudson remained in Canada to look after things there for the present.

MR. AND MRS. ELMER C. HARALDSON

September 12, 1929:

Mr. and Mrs. Elmer C. Haraldson and wife gave up their lives in a struggle to save a load of friends from drowning in Four Mile Lake near Hanley, Sask., Canada on August 11, 1929 at 6:30 p.m. The fatality, which was caused by overloading, occurred about 500 yards from shore, when the small boat, which was powered by an outboard motor, nose-dived into the lake as Haraldson, who had just purchased the craft the day before, speeded up.

Elizabeth Haraldson, 14, worked feverishly to save those who could not swim and managed to get 2 besides her mother to the boat. The latter, however, lost her hold and sank. Mr. Haraldson tried to save Mrs. Kilpatrick, but both were swept under.

Those rescued through the heroic efforts of Elizabeth were George Kilpatrick, Jr., 15 mo. old infant son of Mrs. Kilpatrick who lost her life in the mishap; Lorri Kilpatrick, age 11; Mabel, age 11; Maxine Johnsonm, age 10; and Ruth Budd, 10.

Those who lost their lives in the fatality were Mr. and Mrs. Elmer H., age 40 and 35 respectively; Mrs. George Kilpatrick, 34; and little Dorothy, age 4.

Elmer Haraldson was born in Rock Run township February 17, 1889. He was baptized and confirmed in the Rock Run Lutheran Evangelical Church. He attended school in Davis, then worked on a farm near Davis for his Uncle, K.O. Knudson, then in Alberta, Canada. He traveled in the N.W. and up into Alaska, and finally bought out his brother, Harald, near Hanley, where he had been farming extensively for 15 years.

Myrtle E. Cross Haraldson was born in Davis, Ill., October 30, 1893. She attended school in Davis and was graduated from Mt. Morris College. She then took a course in nursing in Chicago after which, she with her mother, traveled extensively in the U.S.

Elmer Haraldson and Myrtle Cross were married at Davis on June 10, 1914 and went to make their home at Hanley Sask.. Canada.

They leave to mourn their loss, four children: Elizabeth, 14; Hazel, 12; Grace, 10; and Ruth 9.

Elmer H. is survived by his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Thor Haraldson; 4 brothers, Osmund of Hanley Sask., Canada, Harald and Martin of Davis, John of Ottawa, Ill.; 3 sisters, Mrs. George Fisher of Freeport, Mrs. J.W. Herron of St. Louis, Mo. and Mrs. J. B. Laffin of Rockford, Ill.



TRAIN HITS CAR AND FOUR ARE KILLED Loe Family, Formerly of Linn Grove, in Tragedy

News of a train-automobile collision in which members of another entire family were killed reached Spencer Monday. The victims of the tragedy were Mr. and Mrs. E.O. Loe and their two sons of Madelia, Minnesota, former Clay county residents.

Mr. Loe was a nephew of County Superintendent, Ida M. Haroldson and Mrs. Anna Beck, East Third street, and the family formerly lived at Linn Grove. Mr. Loe also has a number of cousins living in the county, Robert H. Beck of Meadow township, Mrs. H.W. Christensen of near Royal, Mrs. Peter Young, living northeast of Spencer, and Mrs. Alfred Underwood of near Peterson. Miss Haroldson left Tuesday for Madelia to attend the funeral services.

Details of the accident are somewhat meagre but, according to word sent Miss Haroldson Monday, the Loe family had been out to the golf grounds near Madelia Sunday. They were returning to their home in the late afternoon when their car was struck by the fast Twin City-Omaha train. The crossing is said to be a dangerous one but whether or not Mr. Loe saw the train before it struck them is not known.

Three Killed Instantly

Mr. and Mrs. Loe and their son Ralph, 8 years of age, were killed instantly. Another son Harold, 14 years of age, was so badly injured that he died Monday night.

Mr. Loe had been a resident of Madelia for the past six years, being cashier of a bank there. He was formerly cashier of the First National bank at Linn Grove, moving to Madelia from that place. He was reared in Linn Grove. He was attending the local schools. His parents Mr. and Mrs. H.E. Loe are now living at Madison, Minn. and they also formerly lived at Linn Grove, etc.

EXCERPTS FROM BOOKLET HONORING 50TH ANNIVERSARY OF BOHRSON SCHOOL DISTRICT, 1956 Hanley, Saskatchewan

It has been said that "Necessity is the Mother of Invention". But it would be equally true to say that "Necessity is the Mother of Migration." History records that migrations of many people through many years have come about as a result of a search for one or more of the four freedoms - freedom of speech and expression, freedom of worship, freedom from fear and freedom from want. No doubt, if we could search out the reasons for the comings and goings of every family in this district, we would find evidence to support our theory that their coming here was tied in with a search for at least one of the four freedoms.

It is true that some of the land in this area (Bohrson District) was originally purchased for speculation but these cases play a small part in the story of our district, which is based on the work of stable, community-minded families who came to find a better home for themselves, and stayed to provide opportunities for their sons. Their lives were not spectacular, but the foundation they laid was strong and true.

At the turn of the century, the farming areas just south of the Canadian border, was populated largely by Norwegian immigrants. Near Langford, S. Dak. we find a typical feeling of urgency which led several families to emigrate to the Hanley, Saskatchewan area.

It was in 1906 that Halvor Loe of Linn Grove, lowa and his brother-in-law, Thor Haraldson of Davis, Ill. bought a section of land nine miles SW of Hanley from T. O. Hamre who was a land cruiser, active in bringing many settlers to this area. H.E. Loe had come from Norway to Wis. as a boy in 1865, later moving with his parents to la. Mr. Loe had taught school after completing his education and had married Ragnild Haraldson in 1881. They had farmed in la. and he had also been in the lumber and grain buying business. All nine children, except Ellis came to Canada. It was Esther who came first with her father in 1907 to help cook for the carpenters while they made a home ready for the family.

Mr. and Mrs. Thor Haraldson (nee Alice Knutson) were also of Norwegian birth and had raised nine children. They farmed in III. but looked to Sask. and Alberta for more land. Harald H. was the first of his family to come to this district. He attended to the farming here but spent the early winters at his family home. The elder Haraldsons never made their home here but visited the district on numerous occasions.

Harald Haraldson, Mabel's brother, son of Thor, had been married in 1912 but he and his wife had returned to the U.S. to live in 1914 due to her poor health. His younger brother, Elmer, who had been farming in Alberta since 1910, was married in 1914 to Myrtle Cross and they came to the Hanley farm to make their home. They had four daughters - Elizabeth, Hazel, Grace and Ruth.

In 1916 Ed Bohrson and Esther Loe were married and made their home across the road from the Thomas Bohrson home. Mr. T. had passed away the year previously, sons George and Henry operating the farm for their mother. Esther and Ed raised five children. In 1928, Ed bought the home farm and moved the family there.

Mr. and Mrs. H.E. Loe and Blanche returned to the U.S. in 1916 leaving the farm in the care of Helmer. Helmer married Freda Hollinger, who had come from Ontario, and they had two sons, Ray and Bill. They lived near Hanley when the boys were attending H.S., returning to the farm later.

Osmund Haraldson had farmed in Alberta before buying land to the SW of the Bohrson district in 1911. In 1920 he had married Anna Reaney, who had come to Saskatoon from her home in N. Ireland in 1911 to complete her nurse's training. They had two sons, Jack and George. After the tragic death of Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Haraldson in 1929 the Osmund Haraldsons moved to their farm for about six years. In 1936 Mr. and Mrs. John Haraldson came up from the States to operate the farm, followed by Mr. and Mrs. Ivor Johnson (nee Elizabeth Haraldson).

The only team of oxen used to break land here belonged to Harald Haraldson. He used them to plow a fireguard around Section 4 in the spring of 1907. They also were used along with a horse and a mule. H.E. Loe bought the oxen from his nephew but no one was too happy to drive them. It seems that when the warm sun brought out the mosquitoes and flies in the spring, the oxen would head for the nearest slough and no amount of persuasion would bring them out.

The prairie sod was broken up in stages - by horse drawn plows, by huge steam outfits and by gas engines. Since weeds were no problem for many years, the same methods of cultivation were used year after year - plowing, discing, seeding with drills, harrowing. Cultivators were introduced gradually. All crops were cut with binders, stocked and threshed - first with steam outfits, later with gas engine power. In more recent years horsedrawn machinery has been almost completely replaced.

HARALDSON DIES: REMBRANDT SAD April 14, 1931

Passing of Pillar of Little Sioux Valley Church - Other Rembrandt News.

Rembrandt — Soren Haraldson, one of the active members of the Little Sioux Valley Church and long prominent in this community, died last week and his funeral was held Friday. The following obituary was read by Rev. Theodore Lerud:

Soren Haraldson

Soren Haraldson was born in Hjartdal, Telemarken, Norway, May 7, 1865. As an infant he was baptized into fellowship with the Triune God. At the age of 10 years he came with his parents to America, arriving at Davis, Ill. The family lived there for the next two years. Then they moved to Buena Vista county, Iowa, locating on a farm near Linn Grove.

When the family arrived in Buena Vista county they affiliated with the Little Sioux Valley Lutheran congregation. In this congregation with 14 other young people, Soren was confirmed May 23, 1880, thus vowing life long allegiance to the Triune God.



THOR SIGURDSON (Thor Haraldson's Uncle) Autobiography as written by him:

A short biography of me and my wife's life and background: Thor Sigurdson is born January 7th, 1833 in Hjaertdal, Telemarken, Norway.

My father and mother were Sigurd Thorson and Martha Hermandsdatter (daughter of Herman). My father was born in Hjaertdal in 1788 and died in 1867. My mother was born in the inner part of Sogn, called Hafslob belonging to the community of Bergen, November 1, 1791 and died November 12, 1879.

My wife, Ingrid, is born in Hjaertdal – her parents, Ole Johan Risvold and Anne Oldsdatter, born on the farm called "Haadtvedt". Ole Johannson was born in 1806 and died in 1863. Anne Oldsdatter (daughter of Ole) was born in 1809 and died in 1892.

My wife, Ingrid, was born on November 30th, 1834. Both of us were baptized and joined in church of Hjaertdal. The minister was Søren Hassing. Until that time in our lives, we knew nothing of the sorrows in the world and had no worries. Though in my home, we often missed even the most important things, this period was the happiest in my whole life. At this time, the beliefs in truth and honesty were grounded in my heart and were told me to be most important. This was told me by my dear, dear parents and has for my whole life been of the greatest help to me.

At that time there were no common schools and I have not attended any school except for 3 days in a school teaching religion, but my dear mother taught me to read and write as she had attended private schools and was very intelligent.

As remembrance for you our dear children, I am writing down mine and your Mother's background and something of our life.

I am born in Hjaertdal, Telemarken, January 7th 1833 of parents, Sigurd Thorson and Marte (Martha) Hermansdatter. My father was born in Hjaertdal in 1789 and died there in 1867. My mother was born in Hafslo in the inner part of Sogn, November 1st, 1797 and died November 12th 1879.

I was baptized and joined the church of Hjaertdal – baptized by the minister Søren Hassing Linkenhagen. Until that time of my life, I had not met or known anything of sorrows or difficulties in life. Though I was brought up under poor conditions.

From now on, I had to go out into the world and work for unknown people to make a living. It was not so easy and I often had a hard time and had to move around in Norway.

When I was 23 years old, I went into the Army. About this I can say nothing good, low earnings and rather low morality.

When I was 28 years old (1858) I met your mother, Ingrid Olsdatter. She was born November 20th, 1834 of parents, Ole Johannesen Risvold, who was born the 31 of August, 1806 and died March 9, 1863. Her mother, Anne Olsdatter, born Haatvedt, was born in 1809 and died in 1892. We are both baptized and joined the church in Hjaertdal in upper Telemarken province. Our minister was Søren Hassing Linkenhagen.

December 6th, 1860, we were married in the same church by the county minister, L. Leno.

April 8th, 1861, we left our home to leave for America. It was indeed a terrible day, to leave our poor parents and the rest of the family and our childhood home which we loved so much. In our thoughts, we knew that we would never see them again, but the decision was made. With hearts filled with sorrow and an almost empty pocketbook, we started to walk to Skien, a town about 75 miles away. At that time of the year, in several places, we had to walk in snow and water up to the knees or as deep as two or three feet. After three days, we arrived in Skien and boarded the ship Mapily. The Captain's name was Lunemark. He was conscientious and a good man and did his best to help all of us. On April 18, the ship left at 7 o'clock in the morning

with 600 people aboard. Then we saw the last of Telemarken as we passed the town of Langesund and sailed away by a northeast wind. All sails were set and soon we were in the open ocean and at sunset we also lost the small islands along the coast which I doubt I will see again. The weather changed from storm to windstill, but after 7 weeks and 4 days, we arrived in Quebec and we could again walk on dry land. The trip by boat had been very hard. We had a lot of sick people on board and 21 died mostly small children. It was terrible to see the bodies being sunk into the ocean, but also the ocean belongs to God. The Bible says that the ocean will bring the dead people to heaven.

We stayed in Quebec 3 days to rest and to get everything cleaned up. Many people lost their lives in the broad and wild St. Lawrence river. It had no compassion for them and took everything. We continued our travel by railway in coaches that were used for transporting cattle (didn't get a human travel car but a freight car). It was not very nice, as manure from the cattle reached to the ankles, though we procured benches to sit upon. After $2\frac{1}{2}$ days, we reached Chicago, and here we were sent like cattle into a storehouse where for several days, we were examined by the railway people from different companies. This ended with each of them picking up a couple of people and so the group was divided. Since then I have only met a few of the group.

My destination was Freeport, Winneshiek Co., lowa where I knew some people so I had bought tickets for that place. For one or another reason we did not arrive there but in Freeport, Illinois and we were completely helpless, where we sat all day at the depot without food and money and no one who understood our language. In the evening, a Swedish lady came and when she understood our difficulty, she told us where the nearest Norwegians were living. We had just enough money to go there by train and we decided to do that. Here the railway agent gave us a guide that led us to a Norwegian farmer. They received us as guests and not as foreigners and this made a friendship which still exists. It was already June 24th, 1861 when we arrived. We stayed here for about a year and started to work very hard, with desire and strength. So our first summer, we saved about \$80 which in my opinion was a large wage for one summers work.

Then we continued to Walvent (maybe Walnut) Co., Wisc., where we lived for 2 years, returned then to Illinois where I bought 40 acres of land. After 3 years I sold it and bought another 60 acres. On this farm I destroyed my health by hard work and I got sick. (He contracted Typhoid and nearly died, and was never strong after that.)

In 1876 I sold our little farm and April 18, 1877 we moved to Buena Vista Co., where I bought this our home, 3½ miles south of Linn Grove. Luck has been with, God be praised and we have been happy, Thank God for that.

Thor Sigurdson died November 4, 1905.

Ingrid Sigurdson died November 8, 1914.

MY HERITAGE

My heritage can be traced back to Norway, the land of the Midnight Sun and the sturdy Vikings.

My Great, Great Grandparents, Great Grandparents and Grandparents lived in Hjaertdal, Telemarken, Norway. These people lived on a small farm which had been handed down as family property. In those days, the posession of land, however small, placed them in the wealthy class and better class of people. Owning a cow was also a sign of wealth. There is a very interesting landmark on this farm, a granary made of Fir wood, which was built in 1200. This building is considered an heirloom by the people living on the farm.

Little is known of my Great, Great Grandparents, they were large, strong and healthy and lived to be very old.

Ole Johanesson Risvold and his wife Anna Olsdatter were the next in Lineage to live on the family place named "Risvold". Ole was a large man with blue eyes and dark hair. He contracted Tuberculosis of the bone at an early age and suffered 6 years before death relieved him. His wife, Anna, was a small and pretty woman. She was also a dark type having dark hair and blue eyes. She lived to be very old and died of old age.

Ole and Anna Risvold had seven children, all were large and had blue eyes and dark hair. Big Ole, the eldest son contracted, perhaps inherited, Tuberculosis and died at an early age.

Johan was born an imbecile and became insane before he died.

Little Ole and Ingrid (my Grandmother) both died of Cancer.

John contracted Pneumonia and died from the disease.

Annia, Sam and Alice were living when this was written.

My Mother's Father's people were also residents of Hjaertdal, Norway. They were very poor people, living by fishing, tailoring and truck farming. My Great Grandfather, Sigurd Thorson, differed from my Mother's people in that he had light hair and blue eyes, he was also large and strong. His wife, Martha Hermansdatter, had dark hair, brown eyes and was of medium height. There are no diseases in this family. Thorson and his wife both died of old age. Their children, Torbjór, Raghnild and Thor died of old age.

My Grandfather's people were very fond of reading and believed in education. My Grandmother had often said that he would rather read and write than do farm work.

The Risvold people were not fond of reading although we know that they could read. This fact proved by the Bible and the names of all the relatives who had access to it. In those days a Bible was very expensive and it took many years wages to pay for it. The Bible, which we have in our posession is printed in Danish in March 1780. Because these people had a Bible, we feel that they could read.

Religion, to my Grandparents' people was very essential to life. Family worship, prayer and church attendances was never neglected. Perhaps they did not understand their religion, but their devotion was truthful and their allegiance was faithful. They are to be admired and respected for their true religious life and for the principles they upheld.

They have always abided by the law both of the state and man. There were no moral defects, which may be accounted for, by their fear, belief and faith in God and the willingness to abide by the law. The pride of these people, was sufficient reason against wrong doing. They were always loyal to one another and their ancestors. They were loyal to their church and state. It is very difficult to speak of their social life, other than saying that they attended church, family dinners, observed Christmas customs, celebrated weddings, buried their dead and took care of other obligations deemed necessary in those days.

Little is known of my father's ancestors. My Grandparents are dead and my Father had little knowledge of his forebearers.

My Grandparents (my father's parents), were born in Hjaertdal, Norway too but some distance from my Mother's parents. Haaken Sewalson (Sevaldson) was tall, large and strong, had dark hair and blue eyes. Oliana Anderson, his wife, was very small, black curly hair and blue eyes. She was very quick in action and of a nervous temperament. Grandfather was more slow and indolent, yet he posessed a will of his own, knew what to do and expected his command to be obeyed.

They had 10 children, five boys and five girls, all of whom were small, active and having dark hair and blue eyes.

Living in Illinois in my Father's day was not the best for educational advantages, yet they did attend school and gained some education. Being poor, their main interest was to work and make a living.

My Father's people were law abiding and very loyal to ancestors, friends and nation. They were of a social nature and very fond of being with people – Friendships were important to them.

My Father is a small man, black curly hair and blue eyes. His actions are quick, much as his decisions are quick and final. He posesses brain ability as well as hand ability. He believes in working for your riches and when riches are gained, not to hoard them but have pleasure of them. My Father is very fond of sports and is ever an ardent supporter.

He believes in new methods and new movements. He has always a temperance man and therefore against "booze". He is very willing to make conditions better and give aid when it is needed.

My Mother is of medium height, has brown hair and blue eyes. She is very fond of books and has always furthered education. She had some High School in Sioux Rapids and a year of teacher's training at Buena Vista college, Storm Lake. She posesses the "Risvold" idea of Christianity and is very faithful to the church and its work. She does not believe in enjoyments that are so common today yet she believes in wholesome entertainment. She has always furthered improvements both local and at home. Through my parents' efforts, our farm is well built up and posessing the modern equipments and facilities of today.

My ancestors all have resided in the country. My early forbearers lived in Norway while my Grandparents and parents have lived in America. There is a change of country, atmosphere and friends but the love of the free, pure and open fields is the same. The lure of the cities did not attract them here in America, showing that they were naturally fond of the country.


